**Course Description:**

This course explores choral and small ensemble music from a wide variety of cultures and time periods through rehearsal and performance. The course is designed to instruct the older adult in vocal techniques, musical notation, sight-reading on solo, small group and large group performances. Students will study basic musicianship and will rehearse and perform as an ensemble.

**Admission Requirements:**

There are no admission requirements, however, during the first class meetings the instructor will work with you to determine the appropriate voice part (SATB) for your unique voice and, if suitable, recommend that a beginning voice class be taken.

**Course Organization/Structure:**

This is an instructor led classroom activity, using choral scores designed to enhance understanding of the topic. The instructor will deliver verbal instruction/critique throughout the rehearsal while the students make musical adjustments as determined by the director.

**Course Goals:**

- Develop an aesthetic awareness and musical skill through singing, listening and analysis. Historical context and musical texts and styles of music will be studied.
- Create musical experiences as a musical ensemble and become a life-long participant of vocal groups and choruses.
- Become musically independent in the areas of reading music, sight-singing, choral blend, performance etiquette and skills through rehearsal and performance.
- Develop an understanding and appreciation of choral repertoire from various cultures and eras.
- Strengthen participant choral musicianship through rehearsal and performance.

**Course Objectives:**

- Improve vocal technique
- Obtain proper breathing tools appropriate for singing
- Learn and demonstrate best practices of tone, blend, and phrasing
- Develop ability to read a choral score
- Gain training in solfege
- Understand elements and form specific to each style and performance practice
- Understand and: implement dynamics, articulation and phrasing as indicated in the choral score
- Rehearse and perform choral literature from a variety of cultures
- Participate in public performance

**Institutional and Student Learning Outcomes:**

- Social Responsibility: Learning and working cooperatively with all members of the class.
- Effective Communication: Communicate clearly with others and seek to understand before seeking to be understood.
- Critical Thinking: Assess information, make choices that benefit the organization and solve problems independently or cooperatively.
- Personal and professional development: personal growth promoting acquisition of effective personal and professional decision-making and problem solving skills.

**Class Attendance/Participation:**

Regular attendance is expected in all SDCCE Emeritus “In person” courses.
